- ❖ Degree courses were launched in 1963. The College got affiliation in Arts and Commerce faculties under Ranchi University in 1965. In the year 1978, Science Faculty was established. The College got permanent affiliation of Commerce faculty and Urdu in 1994 and in the year 1996, permanent affiliation of Science and Arts Subjects.
- ❖ After the inspection of NAAC Peer Team in December, 2004 and the subsequent grading of B+ in February, 2005, the college now, in the

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year:

The Plan of Action formulated by the IQAC of the College for the Academic Year 2005-06 had specified goals to be achieved;

- i) Teaching-learning process to be made more efficient for the better results in the University Examinations.
- ii) More emphasis to be given for the over-all development of the students

1. Curricular Design:

Though the college follows the syllabi of Ranchi University. It was decided by the members of the cell that faculty members will be encouraged to divide the syllabus of university into a task based monthly unit format so that proper and timely coverage of the topics must be ensured.

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2. Examination:

Final examinations are an affair of the affiliating university but it was decided to hold promotional/sent up tests before the filling up of examination forms, with an emphasis on enhancement of results in the University exams.

It was also decided that apart from the aforesaid tests, the teachers will be free to take class tests as and when they will find it fit for the students. A decision was made that faculty members will be asked to hold meetings with the parents of their Honours students at the departmental level.

3. Inter-disciplinary Lectures :

It was decided to make Centre for Academic Development (CAD) more active by organizing talks of faculty members and to invite academicians of the city to deliver lectures.

4. Co-Curricular Activities :

It was felt that the students have great Co-curricular skills and literary and cultural taste. So it was decided to establish a platform for such students, which will ensure the participation of students in literary and cultural activities in and outside the campus.

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5. Add-on Vocational Courses:

In December 2004 the UGC had already given its consent to start Add-on Vocational courses in ;

- i) Aqua Culture
- ii) Industrial Chemistry
- iii) Pollution Management
- iv) Functional English
- v) ASPSM
- vi) e-Commerce

So, it was decided to establish a separate department for Add-on Vocational Courses. It was also decided to furnish the said department with separate infrastructure like Computer, Xerox Machine, Almiarh, Office Table and Chairs. It was further felt to appoint Chief Coordinator and a Peon to run the Department in a fair manner.

6. UGC Network Resource Centre:

In March 2005 the UGC has already given its nod to its Network Resource Centre in the College. It was decided to establish its office in the Room adjacent to the Principal's Office with required infrastructure.

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The Cell was assigned the job of inspiring the academic community of the college (teacher and students) to innovate and to implement tools and measures for the over all satisfaction of stake holders. It was also given the responsibility of planning and implementing programmes related to Sports, Social activities and Co-curricular activities for the all round development of students. It was also given the charge of monitoring the academic activities of the college, advising the management in the structural reformation, if any, that may lead to the academic growth of the college.

PART-B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution :

> A. Career Planning and Guidance Cell:

The Cell organized workshops on stress management measuring stress levels and sources through students-stress scale for the students. Special Career Planning sessions were organized for students belonging to the weaker section of the society. Guidance and counseling were provided at the individual level to check and manage the drop out rates of the students especially those belonging to the minority community.

➤ B. Special Computer training programme was initiated for the non-teaching staff.

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- > C. Financial aid and book bank facilities were made available to poor and needy students.
- ➤ D. For making our student more conversant in English, a
 Certificate course of Spoken English and Personality Development
 was started in Nov. 2005 for 6 months duration.
- ➤ E. Organised Best Paragraph Writing Contest on "Baal-Diwas" in collaboration with Mission Awareness, New Delhi on 21st Nov. 2005.
- ➤ F. Organised a Seminar on "Time Management". Delegates from Career Forum, Jamshedpur participated.
- ➤ G. Founder's Day on 21st January was celebrated with all piety. Different competitions like Debate, Essay writing, Ghazal singing and Blood Donation camp was organized, to mark the occasion.

2. New Academic Programme initiated:

- Add-on Vocational courses were introduced for the regular students belonging to the traditional courses of Arts, Science and Commerce Faculty in order to given them a chance to stand in the job market.
- ➤ The college got recognition from NCTE, Bhubaneshwar for teaching B.Ed. from the year 2005 under Faculty of Education.

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3. Innovation in Curricular Design and Transaction :

➤ Though the College follows the syllabi of Ranchi University, it was decided by the members of the Cell that faculty members will be encouraged to divide the syllabus of university into a task based monthly unit format so that proper and timely coverage of the topics must be ensured.

Faculty members of the Vocational Hons. courses viz Computer Applications, Information Technology and Mass Communication divided their syllabus into units for a task based monthly follow up of the syllabi. It was decided that the same will be tried to achieve with regard to Add-on Vocational courses in the next academic session and for traditional courses in next two years.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started :

Presently the college is running Vocational Course in Computer Application, Mass Communication-Video Production and Information Technology which provides opportunity to our students to opt their subjects from any discipline as their Subsidiary papers in UG classes.

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5. Examination reforms implemented:

- Examination with reference to Promotional Test for the students of Vocational Courses was introduced and implemented by the Departments of Computer Application, Mass Communication and Information Technology.
- ➤ Sent up Test of B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. Part III was organized by the Examination Cell of the college and parents were called to show the examination answer books of their wards.
- Admission Test was held by the Departments of I.T., C.A. and Mass Communication. Class Tests were taken by few teachers only.

Detail of the plans of the Institution for the next year:
