PART- A

Plan of Action

1. Academic activities:

a. The completion of syllabus on time was discussed and heads of departments were advised to divide the portions judiciously for proper monitoring on an annual pattern.

- b. Organisation of Seminars / Conferences under the aegis of Centre for Academic Development (CAD) and encourage teachers to apply for more minor research projects of UGC/ CISR.
- c. Planning of internal exams, test and assignments. Arrangement of sent-up test of Part I students.
- d. A few industrial visits and educational tour will be organized for final year students.
- e. Arrangement of on-job training for our vocational (Hons) students by interacting with local industrial houses.
- f. Relieving the interested teachers for Orientation and Refresher Courses.
- g. Felicitation of University Rank holders at special function.
- h. In a major move the college decided to introduce college uniform for the students so that they will inculcate disciplinary ethics and professionalism of the highest order and will be bound together by a common spirit of oneness and togetherness.

2. **Infrastructure:**

- a. Building expansion will be completed in the Western Block of the building. The department of Mass Communication and Video Production will have a new office and a new shooting studio will also be added to this department which will make the department a special one.
- b. The science faculty will be upgraded. Old flooring will be replaced by a new one. Furniture will be repaired/replace in all the laboratories of science faculty and it will also include the department of Geography and Psychology. The laboratories of the science faculty will be equipped with new equipments. Order will be placed for fresh required equipments as per the demand of respective departments.
- c. The computerized cataloging and bar coding of books in library will be continued. Orders will be placed for new books to be purchased in the library and number of subscription in journals will also be increased.
