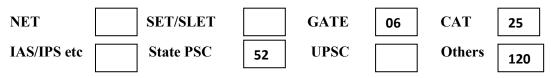

Several students of the College came to the Grievance Redressel Cell with some grievances about the College Canteen and it the Committee requested the Canteen Manager;

That the Canteen should introduce more stuffs in its menu; More soft drinks should be introduced The prices should be subsidized so that it would be affordable

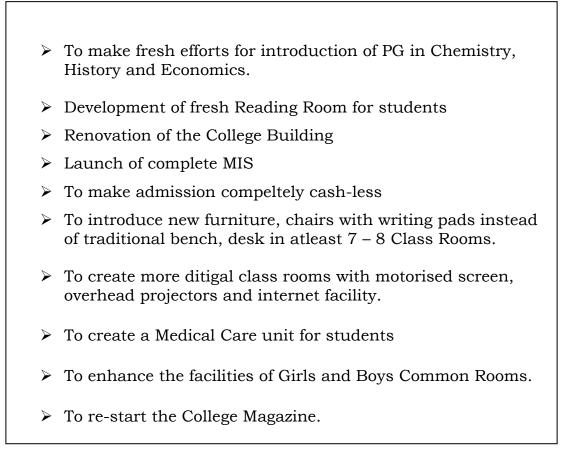
