

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


GUEST LECTURE


GUEST LECTURE




SEMINAR LECTURE




SEMINAR LECTURE




EDUCATIONAL TOUR Venue – Digha

GEOGRAPHICAL SURVEY CAMPS (Plane Table, Prismatic Compass & Dumpy Level)

The Department of Geography at Karim City College conducted a survey camp for the students of B.A (Hons.) Semester – III in Kapali village and Mango Campus Jamshedpur. The camps were organized under the supervision of the HOD of Geography, Dr. Aaley Ali, Dr. Mohammad Reyaz, and Dr. Farzana Anjum. Dr. Anjum demonstrated the instruments used in Plane Table Survey, Dr. Reyaz showcased the Prismatic Compass, and Dr. Ali explained the Dumpy Level. Students were grouped based on the availability of instruments. The Lab assistant, Mr. Khalid also actively supports to the students.

A Plane Table Survey is a traditional method used to create topographic maps or plans of an area. The essential instruments for this survey include the Plane Table, Alidade, Drawing and Mapping Tools, Surveying Chain or Tape, Tripod, Plumb Bob, Leveling Instrument, Field Notebook, Compass, and others.






A Prismatic Compass survey aims to determine the magnetic bearing or azimuth of a specific location or object, crucial for navigation and orientation in the field. Instruments required for this survey are the Prismatic Compass, Tripod, Plumb Bob, Clinometer, Ranging Rods, Magnetic Declination Chart, Topographic Maps, Notebook, and Pencil.

Dumpy level survey instruments encompass theodolites, total stations, and auto levels, used for measuring horizontal and vertical angles, distances, and elevations in land surveying. Dumpy level surveys are essential for determining relative heights or elevations of different ground points for construction, engineering, or land surveying applications. Faculty members provided practical guidance to students on conducting ground-level surveying using these instruments. Finally, all students prepared their surveyed drawings, which were verified by the department's faculty members.
