


WEBINAR


Theme: Weather and Climate: Impact of Covid-19 Lockdown






CLASS TESTS: SEMESTER- V

CLASS TESTS: SEMESTER- VI










INDUCTION PROGRAMME SEMESTER – I SESSION: 2020-23




MENTORSHIP OF STUDENTS

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
SLOW LEARNERS AND ADVANCED LEARNERS









WEBINAR


Theme: Weather Forecasting






PARENTS-TEACHERS MEETINGS Session: 2020-21
