Since Independence, india has made a considerable progress in various sectors of rural development. It is estimated that around seventy percent of the India population is reside in rural areas. People in rural areas do not have the uniform quality of life as enjoyed by the people living in suburban and urban areas. Hence, Rural Development is concerned with economic growth and social justice, improvement in the living standard of the rural people by providing adequate and quality social services and minimum basic needs, becomes essential. For the purpose of extending the benefits to rural people, many schemes were launched to optimize the standard of living and livelihood of the same. This article is aimed to highlight the important programs and schemes run by government of India for rural development.

Introduction

After independence, for the development of rural society, particularly to develop the socio-economic life of the rural poor, many schemes and programmes were launched from time to time but unfortunately the fruits of these programmes reached to a very low proportion of these people. For the purpose of extending the benefits to rural people, many schemes were launched to optimize the standard of living and livelihood of the same. Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP) was launched by the Central govt. in March 1976 as a major tool of the govt. to alleviate poverty. Its main goal was to enable selected families of below poverty line in a given time-frame by taking up self-employment in various activities like agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, weaving and handicrafts and services and business activities. The target group consisted of small and marginal farmers, agricultural labourers and rural artisans having annual
