THE INSTITUTION

The 1940s were formative as well as very fragmenting years for India. Our struggle for independence had started taking not only the final shape but was moving towards a beautiful culmination. This was accompanied by the formation of several governmental and constitutional bodies on one hand and the ill-fated and illogical efforts of dividing the nation on the other. The cracking of India into two distinctive nations was accompanied with trauma and tragedy and in those years when people were facing communal frenzy and were crossing the borders Syed Tafazzul Karim, with a small group of family and friends, was thinking about sowing the seeds of nation and community building. During the horrible years of the 1940s and 1950s when the holocaust of partition was hovering over India and the educated and capable Muslim gentry was migrating to the other side of the border in search of greener pastures, Syed Tafazzul Karim, with his small resources, was lighting the lamp of education for the educationally deprived and weaker section of the society especially the Muslims. He started with the establishment of schools in 1946 and his efforts for the establishment of a college gave fruits in 1961 with the establishment of Karim City College.

Karim City College, located in the heart of the lush and well-planned city of Jamshedpur, is a Muslim Minority Institution run and managed by **Karim's Trust**, **Jamshedpur**, with permanent affiliation to Kolhan University, Chaibasa. Conceived and founded by Late Syed Tafazzul Karim, a socialist and visionary at heart, in the decades immediately succeeding India's independence with the intention of promoting culture and education among the weaker sections of the city's industrial populace, particularly its Muslim society, the college came into existence with

pre-university courses as part of its curriculum. The response to the educational manifesto of the institution in those early years of its establishment, being highly encouraging, degree courses were launched in the college in the year 1963. With the sad demise of its founder in 1964, the institution was patronized by his son Late S. M. Shafiq under whose able steering, the institution achieved important milestones. With affiliation being acquired in 1965 from Ranchi University for its degree courses of Arts and Commerce, the college made its formal entry into higher education, ushering in a span of sustained and motivated progress, accelerated by the establishment of its Faculty of Science in the year 1978. The institution overcame the setback caused by the passing away of its patron S. M. Shafiq in the year 1992 with the taking up of the mantle of leadership by his son Mr. Syed Ashfaq Karim. Since then, there has been no looking back and the institution has confidently surged ahead in its quest for excellence, continuing to champion through its tireless efforts, its Founder's vision of education for empowerment, for self-sufficiency and for social change.

In the last two decades, the institution has witnessed a steady course of progress, expansion and accomplishment with the accordance of permanent affiliation to its various traditional courses and with the launch of vocational courses. In the year 2004 the college went for its first assessment by NAAC and was awarded a grade of B+. In the year 2010, the college was accorded CPE status by the UGC under its XIth Plan in acknowledgement of its steady academic performance and strengthening infrastructural facilities. The institution, over the years, has been persistent in its efforts to improve and upgrade itself in accordance with the changing needs, patterns, and parameters of higher education. Evolving innovative educational and managerial paradigms, making bold decisions, and pursuing challenging goals, the college went for its second and third cycle of NAAC accreditation in the year 2012 and 2018 and was awarded B++ and B+ grade respectively. In the year 2013, the institution inaugurated a new state-of-the-art campus at Mango to which its Faculty of Education and intermediate courses were shifted with a view to make use of a well-planned, more spacious campus and better infrastructural facilities.

Committed to promoting quality education aligned to life's intellectual and vocational needs and to the changing needs of the society and nation, the college today has carved a respectable niche for itself in the city's educational landscape and within its socio-cultural fabric. Today, it boasts strength of more than five thousand students in its various under-graduate and post-graduate courses and has received recognition, local, regional, and national, for its skilled academic faculty and its competent administrative staff. The college hopes in the years to come, to branch out into full-fledged postgraduate teaching and to take up research functions in keeping ideological pace with the academic demands of higher education. Strongly inclined to the belief that education is holistic and multi-faceted, the college has zealously and consistently promoted co-curricular activities, unleashing and generating talent in fields as diverse from creative writing to dramatics and from fine arts to sports. Students of the college have made their mark in life not only as competent job-seekers and empowered wage-earners but also as creative, mature and responsible

individuals who have been trained and encouraged to make a difference wherever they are.

In an attempt to engender and nurture within its students a strong all around personality, creativity, sense of civic responsibility and social consciousness, the college offers consistent encouragement to active engagement in varied activities through its various student wings such as SPArC, NSS, NCC, and Rotaract Club. Equality, Equity and Respect being watchwords of the institution's culture, the campus boasts of amity and harmony between men and women, between students and teachers, and between its teaching and non-teaching staff members. In the college campus, discipline constitutes an important institutional concern and the institution's regulations, therefore, offer strict provisions for instilling and maintaining discipline among the students. Strictly enforced norms of behavior in the campus, adherence to a college uniform, regular patrolling by teachers, the existence of a Discipline Committee, an Anti-Ragging Cell, a Women's Cell and a Grievance Redressal Cell constitute, among others, important means of maintaining the sanctity and sanity of the campus for educational purposes. The college realizes that the character of its students constitutes a prime parameter for the evaluation of its success or failure as an educational institution and hence, focus on character-building through teaching and co-curricular activities has always occupied an important place in its agenda. Today, the institution is proud to have its alumni disseminated across all parts of the country and abroad, rendering their services to society in various professional capacities, and to have them look back upon their alma mater with gratitude and affection.

Though the College intends to work for the educational betterment of the weaker section of the society especially Muslims, its doors are open for everyone without any consideration of region, religion, caste, colour or creed. The College, at present, is catering more than 5000 students at UG and PG level. Apart from running the traditional **B.A.**, **B.Sc.**, **B.Com.** courses under the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme of NEP 2020 and Post-Graduation in Mathematics, Chemistry, Commerce, Psychology, English and Urdu, the college also offers Vocational UG Degree in Mass Communication, Computer Applications, Information Technology and Vocational (Self-financed) P.G. Degree in Mass Communication. From 2023-2024 the college launched B.B.A. and a one-year PG Diploma in Guidance and Counselling. From this academic session the college intends to offer M. A. in Political Science. The College also offers B.Ed. under its Faculty of Education. In an effort to provide an opportunity of dual degree to its students the College offers nine **Add-on (Vocational) Courses** for students pursuing traditional UG Courses. The College runs a plethora of courses through its Centre for Distance Education which hosts Study Centres of IGNOU and Maulana Azad National Urdu University.

The College is committed to the cause of education and strives to inculcate good academic and human values among students. It undertakes a large number of co-curricular, extracurricular and extension activities in order to ensure the holistic growth of students towards mature individuals, responsible citizens and empathic human beings.

THE LANDMARKS

In keeping pace with the changing scenario of modern education and in order to implement the Central Government's New Education Policy, the college, with the strategic support and assistance of the University Grants Commission, New Delhi and Ministry of HRD, Govt. of Jharkhand, has been continuously striving to play a significant role in the increase of GER of the country. It is taking sincere efforts to achieve academic milestones by providing quality education for the various courses that it has been running and by launching various vocational/Professional courses time to time. It has the Honour of being the first college in Eastern India to start a three-year Honours Degree Course in Mass Communication & Video Production in the year 1997. The Department of Mass Communication & Video Production has a saga of success in producing trained media personnel who are making their presence felt in the print, visual and audio media of the country. The department presently offers Graduation, Post-Graduation and Add-on Courses under Kolhan University, Chaibasa. Under the capable guidance of Dr. Neha Tiwari, the department plans to surge ahead in the coming years in the field of Media Studies and research.

A new step was further taken when the college introduced two more vocational courses i.e. Computer Applications and Information Technology in the year 2003. The Departments of Computer Applications & Information Technology have a brilliant performance record and boasts of sound infrastructure and a competent faculty. Headed by Dr. Anwar Shahab the departments have consistently excelled in the computer & IT education. The Departments are presently involved in the teaching of Graduation (Computer Applications & B.Sc. I.T) and Add-on courses under our parent university i.e. Kolhan University, Chaibasa and look forward to playing a major role in the dissemination of Computer Science and Information Technology within the state of Jharkhand and in the country at large.

Jharkhand has been consistently facing a great dearth and crisis of trained teachers in the state as a result of which the State government asked its universities to start B.Ed. in their colleges. Taking benefit of this policy, the college with the approval of Kolhan University, Chaibasa and NCTE, Bhubaneswar, has started a **B.Ed. Course** in **2005** which is growing with a successful track record. With **Dr. Sucheta Bhuiyan** as head and with the zealous services and dedication of its faculty members, the **Faculty of Education** is committed to gift the society a team of quality teachers who will augment its educational fabric. The college has shifted its Faculty of Education to its new campus at Mango from the academic year 2013-14.

The UGC, New Delhi has adopted a new educational strategy in introducing its policy of dualdegree scheme. Under this programme, a student while pursuing his/her degree part I, II, & III may also enroll for a Certificate, Diploma and Advance Diploma course respectively. With the approval of UGC, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of Jharkhand and Kolhan University, Chaibasa, the college runs nine career-oriented courses under the Department of Add-on (Vocational) Courses. These Add-on Courses are being nurtured by the college in order to render it beneficial for the career growth of students.

The UGC under its XIth plan awarded the college with 'College with Potential for Excellence' (CPE) status in acknowledgement of its infrastructural facilities and academic performance. The status of CPE enabled the college to strengthen its base and build a more result-oriented academic atmosphere which helped in transforming the college to a great extent.

The college was assessed and accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Bangalore in the year 2004. The college was re-accredited by NAAC in the year 2012 and 2018 and is striving hard to equip and enhance itself as per the parameters and recommendations of this esteemed body. Gearing up for its fourth cycle of NAAC accreditation this year, the college hopes to offer for expert evaluation its strengths and weaknesses as an institution and to participate fruitfully in the entire learning experience that such evaluation involves.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell

IQAC is a post-accreditation quality enhancement and sustenance measure that aims to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the academic, administrative and financial performance of the institution. With the assistance of Dr. S. M. Yahiya Ibrahim as Coordinator and Dr. Mohd. Moiz Ashraf as Assistant Coordinator, a team has been constituted to plan, coordinate, and monitor the functioning of the college in an effort to give the stakeholders an opportunity to participate in the cross-sectional and multi-dimensional performance of the institution. The IQAC is a great changing force and a tool for sustenance and up-gradation. It does act as a suggestive body for the sustenance and assurance of quality with reference to academic, administrative, financial, infrastructural and student support areas but more than this it is a major role player in planning, implementation and execution of multifarious developmental activities. MIS, multipurpose digital ID Cards, Digitisation, Help Desk, CCTV, Digital Notice Boards, Free Wi-Fi for students, LCD TVs for Student Common Rooms are a few among many projects that are undertaken by the IQAC. It has been continuously organising workshops for teaching and non-teaching staff and motivational programmes for students. The Feed Back Analysis mechanism, SWOC Analysis mechanism, publication of Academic and Activity Calendar, Curriculum Distribution, Student Seminars, Parent-Teacher meetings, Student mentoring,

Academic and Administrative Audit, Student Satisfaction Survey are a few concepts that were introduced and undertaken by the IQAC. The College website has also been managed and updated under the guidance of IQAC and the practice of uploading Class Routines, gist of lectures and programme & course outcomes on the College website has also been introduced by the IQAC. From the last few years the College is publishing its Academic and Activity Calendar and efforts have been made to ensure its implementation under the aegis of the IQAC. The IQAC monitors the effectiveness of all teaching learning activities, co-curricular, extracurricular and extension activities and corrective measures are suggested to the College Management for redressing the lacuna. A look on the Action Taken Report (ATR) uploaded on the IQAC section of the website may also prove helpful to gauge the role and involvement of IQAC in the developmental activities of the College.

NEP Implementation Cell & Student Help Desk

With the implementation of New Education Policy (NEP 2020) from the academic session 2022-2023 the college has established NEP Implementation Cell. The cell will try to look after the implementation of New Education Policy in the college. Through its Student Help Desk the cell will help and guide the students so that they can largely get facilitated and benefited by the NEP.

Management Information System (MIS)

In accordance with the aspirations of the UGC and NAAC and under the guidelines of RUSA-Jharkhand the college has introduced Management Information System (MIS) for the purpose of proper management and sharing of data from the academic session 2016-17. It has been currently managed by Master Soft, a Pune based IT company that works in the field of educational management and administration. MIS covers the academic, financial and administrative aspects of the college. It digitally records the whole journey of a student from his/her entry to his/her graduating from the college. Students as well as staff members are provided with digital ID cards which are actually multipurpose cards used as Identity Card and library card. The same is used as fee cards for students as also for the management of every type of data. **Bulk messaging service** has also been introduced under MIS. Student specific data access with regard to attendance, marks of inter assessment etc. has been provided through the **College App**. The college library runs its services through MIS and issue of certificates & testimonials has also been done through MIS.

Rashtriya Ucchatar Siksha Abhiyan (RUSA)

Rashtriya Ucchatar Siksha Abhiyan (RUSA) is a governmental scheme which has been jointly financed by **Govt. of India** and the **Government of Jharkhand.** The scheme aims at academic and infrastructural development of leading colleges of the state. Karim City College was among the first thirty colleges of the state that were selected for RUSA I. The College has already utilized the

funds released by the government. Substantial infrastructural and academic changes have taken place due to this in the last few years. Upgradation of library and laboratory, enhancement of sports facilities, upgradation of class rooms, establishment of new e-class rooms, extension of reading room, renovation of the whole campus etc. has been undertaken with the assistance of this scheme. The RUSA grants in general and the motivational approach of the officials of **Department of** Higher & Technical Education, Govt. of Jharkhand in particular has surely helped the college to strengthen its infrastructural standards.

Language Resource Centre

The college espouses a very promising project in the form of its Language Resource Centre. With technical assistance from Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL), Mysore, a state-of-the art Lingua-Lab has been set up by the college in order to renovate the teaching and learning methods of languages in the campus. With its sophisticated gadgets and latest language software, the Centre is the first of its kind in the whole region and aims at augmenting the linguistic excellence of our students and ensuring better career opportunities for them. In nurturing multilingualism and inculcating more effective communication skills, our students will be better placed in their aspired academic and professional sectors such as information Technology, Travel and Tourism, Fashion Designing, Interior Decoration, Entertainment, Mass Media, Finance etc. To cater to this need, the Language Resource Centre runs a few language based courses from time to time. Information regarding language courses is given to students through notices and posters released during the course of an academic session.

Centre for Academic Development

To strengthen the atmosphere of academic excellence and to create a research-oriented approach among the teachers, the college has established the Centre for Academic Development (CAD) which frequently organises seminars and symposiums on topics of varied educational interest. Faculty members of the College as well as scholars and experts from different fields present their papers under the banner of CAD. The Centre, under the admirable leadership of its Coordinator, **Dr. Sandhya Sinha**, is dedicated to strive towards the development of an inter-disciplinary approach to academics through a series of lectures that are well attended by the faculty members and students.

Research and Development Cell

This cell has been created in accordance with the UGC guidelines to nurture and promote a culture of research among faculty members. Adhering to the requirements of New Education Policy 2020 the cell, under the convenership of Dr. Zaki Akhtar, plans to involve the students of PG departments to think in the direction of R&D. The cell plans to organise research workshops, motivational workshops and events on research and to start a culture of projets, paper writing and publication etc.

New Campus at Mango

The College has developed a new state-of-the-art campus at Mango, Jamshedpur. The building is equipped with all modern amenities and quality infrastructural facilities. Teaching of B.Ed. and Intermediate Courses (I.A./I.SC./I.COM.) is undertaken at Mango Campus.

Centre for Distance Education

The College is striving hard to fulfill its commitment i.e. the educational upliftment of the weaker sections of the society especially the Muslim minority. Hence it has established a Centre for Distance Education which intends to provide affordable education to those who are not able to join the mainstream education. The CDE consists of two separate study centres of IGNOU and MANUU.

Study Centre of IGNOU

The centre runs Bachelor's Degree Programmes in Arts & Commerce and Master's Degree Programmes in English, Hindi, History, Economics, Political Science, Public Administration, Sociology, Philosophy, Psychology, Commerce and Translation Studies, under the aegis of IGNOU. The centre offers PG Diploma Programmes in Urban Planning & Development, Journalism Mass Communication, Audio Programme Production, Education Management, Education Technology and International Business Operations. It undertakes Diploma Programmes in Creative Writing in English and Certificate Programmes in Teaching of English and Goods & Services Tax. The centre has also started a certificate course in Urdu for non-Urdu speaking populace. It is a recognized Study Centre (32024) of IGNOU and is striving hard to spread education among those who are unable to participate in the normal stream of education due to social, financial or occupational constraints. With Dr. S. M. Yahiya Ibrahim as its Coordinator, the centre has ambitious plans to introduce new programmes eventually in an effort to reach the unreached.

Study Centre of Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad.

The College has been selected to run **B.Ed.** course under the distance mode of MANUU (Maulana Azad National Urdu University) from the academic session 2017-18. The course is being offered to Urdu knowing students and it is very cost effective. The centre, located at Faculty of Education Campus at Mango, Jamshedpur, is moving ahead under the able guidance of **Dr. Ashraful Hoda**.

NEW MILESTONES

E-Class Rooms

The College constantly attempts to maximize the use of **ICT** (Information and Communication Technology) to make the teaching – learning process more learner-centric. In order to promote new and advanced techniques of teaching and learning, it has set up ten e-class rooms equipped with overhead projection, smart boards, screens and internet connectivity. These classrooms are designed to impart education to the students in a highly dynamic manner. The College plans to develop more E-class rooms in the near future.

Math's Lab

In an effort to provide ICT-based education and in order to make the teaching-learning process more effective, the college has established a Math's Lab which makes the teaching of mathematics more innovative and student-oriented. The lab is equipped with computers of latest configuration, teaching software and online facilities.

Auditorium and Student Activity Centre

Our parent trust i.e. Karim's Trust Jamshedpur has given us the campus of an old cinema hall which has been developed as college auditorium and student activity centre. The auditorium accommodates 800 persons at a time and hosts seminars and conferences, all kinds of literary and cultural activities as well as different functions and programmes of the college. The student activity centre has a small gym, rehearsal zone and a meeting zone. The activity centre also holds Activity Classes in music, fine art, debating and theatre under the aegis of SPArC.

Talking Books

In order to facilitate visually challenged students the college has procured software through which printed books can be converted into talking books. Students can make the computer read the hard copies and can also make a record of it. A separate booth, accommodative of two students at one time has been installed in the virtual library. This service is open for the visually challenged students of other institutions also.

KCC E-quip: A YouTube Channel for Students

The lockdown due to Covid-19 created a situation in front of all academic institutions as how to cater the need of students in the time of crisis. The college, under the instruction of UGC and the parent university started its own YouTube channel KCC E-quip to provide video lectures and study materials to the students through its website. Though the step was taken in the light of Covid 19 lockdowns but the college management has decided to continue this service under normal circumstances also for the benefit of our students. In near future, under the care and guidance of **Dr. Basudhara Roy,** KCC E-quip will be a huge store house of video lectures and study materials available online. In future efforts will also be made to arrange the recordings of online/classroom lectures also. The college also plans to convert KCC-Equip as a full-fledged platform for online courses.

Innovation Ecosystem and Incubation Centre

The centre has recently been established with an aim to provide a positive ecosystem to foster innovation through various initiatives. Under the leadership of **Dr. Neha Tiwari** as Convener, the IEIC aspires to evolve research aptitude and entrepreneurial attitude in the students through various activities and training programmes. IEIC also intends to support young minds to transform their innovative ideas into business opportunities. The centre also acts as bridge between industry, experts and students. IEIC has adopted the National Innovation and Startup Policy 2019 proposed by the MHRD, Government of India.

Integrated Teaching Learning & Excellence, Attendance Modules & College App

With the assistance of its IT service provider i.e. Master Soft, Pune, the college has developed its Integrated Teaching Learning & Excellence module, attendance module and student's app. Student attendance in their class is now being captured digitally. Digital messages, notices and other vital information are being sent to the students through Master Soft Cloud (student app). Subject wise and teacher wise weekly and daily routines are available to the students. In the coming time online internal assessment tests of the students will be managed through the same mechanism and online study materials, e-books and gist of lectures will also be shared. The students are now paying their fee through the app.

Introduction of Postgraduate Courses

Higher Education, despite its widespread promotion, remains to a large extent a dream for a large chunk of the population in our country. The consecutive governments in general and academicians in particular have been striving hard to raise the enrollment ratio in higher education up to a respectable level but still the country lags far behind the international percentage of enrollment in higher education. The number of colleges, universities, and other institutions of higher learning has increased manifold since independence but the democratization of higher education and its availability to the common people of the country is still a far cry. The college, with its deep commitment towards and concern for the educational upliftment of the weaker sections of the society, especially minorities, is deeply committed to this ongoing drive of inclusive growth in the educational sector of the country.

After its first accreditation by NAAC in 2004 the college administration undertook the effort of introducing Post-Graduate courses for its students. A hard struggle ensued and the strong sense of commitment towards society paid its dividend when M.A. in Mass Communication was introduced. The effort to convert the college into a full-fledged post-graduate institution is still continuing. M.A. in Urdu and M.Sc. in Mathematics were introduced in the campus in the year 2014 and M.A. in Psychology and M.Com. in the year 2015. M. Sc. Chemistry and M.A. in English began from the academic session 2020-21 & 2022-23 respectively. Now the college is planning to start M.A. in Political Science from this academic session i.e. 2024-25.

The College Library has equipped itself in accordance with the requirements of PG courses. Text books, reference books and journals are being arranged as per the PG syllabuses. In addition, PG departments are maintaining their own **Departmental Library** to cater to the requirements of both teachers and students. The ITLE as well as the dedicated digital library module also facilitates our students and enable them to access e-books, e-journals, study materials and teacher's lectures etc. The membership of INFLIBNET and the Virtual Library Cum Net Surfing Centre is also helpful in catering to the needs of our PG students. Facilities of e-cataloguing, multipurpose digital ID cards and the facility of photocopying and printouts also enable the college library to serve the PG students in a better way.

Academics are invited for guest lectures and various in-house seminars and symposia are organized to develop the capacity of PG students for in-depth study and critical thinking. In the near future and as per the needs of our students, the P.G. Departments will strive to provide coaching and guidance to their postgraduate students for the preparation of UGC-NET/JRF examination.

The college is committed towards its goal of excellence and inclusive growth in the field of education and intends to progress further in its dream run by adding the feather of more post-graduate courses to its cap in the coming years.

Centre for Guidance and Counselling

The College has recently established a Centre for Guidance and Counselling which runs a one year Post Graduate Diploma Course in Guidance and Counselling for the training of professionals in guidance and counselling combining the hybrid mode (online & face to face). The course aims at enhancing the skills and competencies of teachers to promote holistic development of pupils and handle their academic, socio-emotional and ethical problems. The course is open to teachers, educators, school administrators and untrained guidance personnel (any graduate) from India. Admission to eligible candidates for a limited number of seats will be offered normally from the month of August every year.

All the books of the library are bar-coded and are issued electronically to the students. In keeping up with its user-centered efforts, the college Library has successfully installed **E-cataloguing system.**

The college Library is connected with **INFLIBNET** (a Govt. of India project) through which students and faculty members may utilize hundreds of e-books and e-journals, both national and international. All newly admitted students must contact the college library to get their INFLIBNET ID through which they can have free access to huge consortium of Ph.D. theses, research papers and study materials named e-shodh sindhu, e-shodhganga etc. Currently more than 3500 student ids have been generated on the INFLIBNET. Currently our INFLIBNET membership provides a huge database of books: Proquest (185000+ e-books), EBSco (936 e-books), Springer (2300 e-books), Cambridge University Press (1800 e-books), ISEAS (382+ e-books), Sage Publications (1000 e-books), McGraw Hills (1124 e-books) & 05 e-journals.

The college Library has a **reading room** with a seating capacity of 100 students at one time which the students may use for their academic pursuits. The reading room remains open during the college hours. Students are expected to utilize this and other facilities of the library to the optimum level.

Students, while availing of the library facilities, are expected to follow certain rules:

I. The library remains open from 8.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. However, due to heavy work load,

- separate timing is fixed for the issue of books.
- Two books can be issued to a student at a time for a period of two weeks. II.
- III. College ID card serves as the library card which has to be produced by the student at the issue counter for borrowing books.
- IV. Strict silence must be maintained in the Reading Room and at the issue counter. Nothing should be done by way of smoking, spitting or otherwise, which may run contrary to the decorum and discipline of the library.

Virtual Library & Rauzan, the offline library portal

The College has introduced the concept of E-learning by establishing a Virtual library in the offline mode. The Virtual Library, equipped with twelve internet connected computers, is available for students. The library also runs its offline e-library portal named Rauzan which can be accessed by the students inside the college campus only. **E-books**, **E-journals** and previous years question papers are being made available for the students. The students may also upload books or study materials on the portal for the benefits of others.

The College library also provides a huge consortium of e- books through the student app. The college library will continuously upload books as well as scanned copies of printed books through its Integrated Library Management System (ILMS). This will be made available to the students through Master Soft Cloud (student app) which will also offer the facility of uploading notes both by the teachers, E-notices, e-routines etc.

Talking Books

In order to facilitate visually challenged the college has procured software through which printed books can be converted into talking books. Students can make the computer read the hard copies and can also make a record of it. A separate booth, accommodative of two students at one time has been installed in the virtual library.

Photocopy and Printing Facility

The college library provides photocopy & printing facility for the students and staff members so that text books, reference books and relevant study materials can be photocopied, or printed at subsidized rate.

Net Surfing and free Wi-Fi Facilities

Free net surfing facilities are available to the students in the Virtual library. The college also provides free Wi-Fi services to all its students and staff.

Common Rooms & Gymnasium

The College has separate Common Rooms for Boys and Girls having facilities like Table Tennis, Carom Board, Chess, Ludo, Chinese Checkers etc. Magazines and Newspapers are also provided to them. Dr. Shahid Ahmad Hashmi, Department of Mathematics and Dr. Kauser Tasneem, Department of History are the in-charges of common room (boys) and common room (girls) respectively. Indoor games championship is organized every year for the students.

A gymnasium has been established at the Student Activity Centre which offers membership to our students at a very nominal fee.

Scholarship Cell

The college has established Scholarship Cell under the guidance of Dr. Ajaz Ahmad, Head, Dept. of Economics to provide scholarship assistance. The students are guided for different scholarship schemes provided by the government. The college provides guidance and support to the students belonging to SC, ST, OBC and Minority category to apply at NSP (National Scholarship Portal) and for other government scholarships. Applications for Stipends received from the students belonging to Schedule castes, Schedule Tribes and Backward Classes are recommended by the college for realization of their fees to the District Welfare Department. At the time of admission, students belonging to these categories shall have to produce caste and income Certificates duly issued by the Additional Deputy Collector or Revenue Officer. No Certificates will be accepted after Admission.

The college also offers **financial assistance** to the needy students through its own resources. For this the college has introduced merit cum means scholarships. Syed Tafazzul Karim Scholarship for boys and Mehrunnisa Scholarship for girls have been given to meritorious and needy students. On the ground of poverty and merit, free Studentship up to 12.5% of the total number of students on the college roll is given. Besides, the college awards book grants and other help to needy students.

SC, ST, OBC & Minority Cells

These cells are created under different ordinances passed time to time by the UGC to safeguard the interest and well-being of the students belonging to scheduled caste, scheduled tribes, other backward castes and minorities.

Canteen and Parking Space

The college canteen remains open during working days serving light snacks and other eatables at a reasonable price. It is, however, expected from the students that they will use this facility judiciously and do not waste their precious time in long conversations or misdemeanor in the college canteen. Space has been provided in the college campus to park bicycles but no responsibility lies with the college in case of theft or damage.

Disciplinary Committee

To ensure smooth and peaceful academic environment the college has established a Discipline Committee which keeps strict vigil in the campus. Under its Convener, Dr. Aaley Ali, Head, Dept. of Geography, the committee checks indiscipline and unruly activities in the campus, motivates the students to pursue their studies in good faith and harmony and ensures that they do not engage in any kind of passionate, frenzied and lawless behaviour.



- Do not loiter around or congregate near the classrooms and in the corridors.
- Do not stand in front of or near a classroom when a teacher is engaging the class.
- Continuous Internal Assessments (CIA), as per the newly implemented NEP 2020, are held on regular basis and students must appear in such examinations. The marks scored in CIA will be added in the final score of the students. Keep yourself informed about the internal assessments.
- It is expected from the students that they will be regular in their classes. 75% attendance is compulsory for the students to fill up their examination form of the University. Marks are awarded for attendance also. No special classes will be arranged to make up for the shortage in attendance.
- Every student of the College is provided with a multipurpose digital identity card at the time of admission. Students must keep their Identity Card with them while in the campus. No student will be allowed to Enter the college campus without valid identity card. The College authorities may demand their identity card as and when required. In case of damage or loss, new identity card will be issued to the student only after clearance by the Disciplinary Committee. For the Re-issue of identity card a Student has to deposit a fee fixed by the college.
- The Heads and other teachers of the departments concerned are authorised to take justified action against irregular and indisciplined students.
- The In-charges and members of different faculties, Discipline Committee, Anti Ragging Cell, Grievance Redressal Cell and Women's Cell are authorised to keep strict vigil in the campus.
- No society, association, union or club can be formed in the name of the college without permission of the principal.
- No meeting shall be convened and no person shall be invited to address any meeting or gathering without permission of the principal.
- Students should not participate in any political or religious activities inside the college campus or outside in the name of the college.
- Students should not collect money or raise fund inside or outside the campus in the name of the college.
- Students must bring their parents when asked for either by the college administration or by the HOD for parent-teacher meeting.
- · Students should follow the prescribed dress code of the college.
- Be punctual and regular in your classes.
- Be punctual if you have any fixed appointments either with teachers or administrative staff.
- Inform the person concerned if you are going to be absent or delayed for an activity which you are expected to attend.

- Use of any intoxicant, tobacco, cigarette, gutkha or paan masala is strictly prohibited.
- Students are supposed to show due respect, courtesy and consideration to their teachers and other college staff. They must maintain a feeling of compassion and brotherhood towards their fellow students.
- Original School / College leaving Certificates, deposited at the time of admission will not be returned. Hence, the students are advised to keep sufficient number of photocopies of such certificates.
- Character and Provisional Certificates may be issued on payment of Rs. 50/- only.
- CLC & TC will be issued on payment of Rs.150/. In case of theft or loss, a Duplicate CLC & TC will be issued only after presentation of an AFFIDAVIT issued by the Notary on payment on an extra amount of Rs.50/-. CLC & TC will be issued after a week from the date of application.
- Students have to produce identity card, Admit Card, Fee Card and other relevant testimonials at the time of applying for any certificate.
- Strict Disciplinary action, to the extent of expulsion from the college, may be taken against a student who does not abide by the rules and regulations laid down by the college authorities.
- Any legal matter related to the college will be dealt within the jurisdiction of Jamshedpur Court only.
- KCC is a community and as members of this community the students are expected to adhere to KCC's rules and regulations, to show respects for persons and property and to behave in a way that does not interfere with the normal operations and functioning of the college.
- Where there is a reason to believe that rules and regulations have been broken, norms have been breached and/or when the behavior of a student falls below the expected standards the Disciplinary Code and Procedure will be initiated by the proper authorities.

Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM)

UGC, NAAC and other regulatory bodies of Higher Education expects that educational institution should organise meeting of stake holders from time to time. The Colleges are expected to organise meetings of their teachers and parents who are the two major stake holders. The various academic departments of Karim City College organise such meetings at regular intervals and it is expected from the parents and the students that they should ensure their presence in PTMs as and when informed by the college or the departments.

Dress Code

The college management has implemented a DRESS CODE for the students of **B.A./B.SC./B.COM.** in order to inculcate among them disciplinary ethics and professionalism of the highest order. Uniformity of dress will create a spirit of oneness in the students and they will imbibe a value of togetherness and fraternity.

Boys are supposed to wear Black Pant and Stripped Shirt (information about the colour of shirt will be displayed on college notice board at the time of admission) with KCC Sticker pasted on the pocket along with black belt and black leather shoes.

Use of black jeans, sport shoes or fancy foot wears and ornamental belts are not allowed.

Girls are supposed to wear Black Shalwar and Stripped Kameez (information about the colour of kameez will be displayed on college notice board at the time of admission) with KCC sticker pasted on the sleeve. Girls are expected to wear black pump shoes or black sandals only. In case of hijabs or scarves the girl students should ensure that it will be either black or white (not of any other colour).

Use of black jeans, fancy churidars or leggings and designer foot wear are not allowed.

In winter the students may wear a black blazer/sweater/cardigan. Woolen of any other colour and jackets are strictly prohibited.

Etiquettes of Using Cell Phones in the Campus

The college administration discourages the use of cell phones in the campus. However, mobile phones may be used under critical situations or some emergency. The students are not allowed to use cell phones inside the classrooms and corridors. It can be used in the courtyard, common rooms and canteen. Students are expected to keep their cell phones on silent mode and they may take calls only when it is urgent. Headphones are not allowed and students shall not capture any video or photo inside the campus without permission. Playing videos or music on cell phones is not allowed. Any violation of these norms will lead to stringent action.

ADMISSION BULLETIN FOR UNDER GRADUATE COURSES

The college is admitting students in the First Year (two semesters) of its Under Graduate courses under the newly implemented Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) for the academic session 2024-25. Online admission in **B.A, B.Sc., B.Com.** Major course is available through Chancellor's Portal. After the completion of online admission the student should contact the college office for confirmation of his/her admission. He/She will have to purchase the College Prospectus and application forms from the college counters after a payment of Rs. 500. The completely filled in form along with the photocopy of all required documents has to be submitted in the office within two days after the issue of form.

Steps for Admission

- The first part of the whole admission process has to be done online.
- Candidates are required to apply through CUET and Chancellor's Portal.
- A Selection List will be published. After their selection in the list the candidates have to pay the Registration fee of Kolhan University through the Chancellor's Portal.
- After completion of the above process the candidates are now required to go to the website of the college for the online payment of college fee.
- After online payment of college fee the students have to contact the college office in person and purchase the college prospectus along with a form from the college counter.
- The completely filled in form along with attested/scanned copies of mark sheets of the qualifying exam and other testimonials should be submitted to the college within two or three days.
- The college reserves every right to cancel the admission in case of any misappropriation or misconduct on part of the selected candidate.
- · Candidates have to collect their College Roll Numbers.
- Selected candidates are required to complete the Registration process of Kolhan University as and when directed by the university.
- The following documents will be required for submission at the time of verification:

- a. Originals College Leaving Certificate with a photocopy of the same.
- b. Photocopies of Mark sheets (Matric & Intermediate) & Admit Card.
- c. Original Migration Certificate.
- Selected candidates, belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes, are required to submit the photocopy of their caste certificate along with original income certificate. In case of non-availability of any of the said certificates, the application of the concerned students will not be forwarded to the welfare Dept. for grant of financial help from the Govt. and he/she will have to pay the tuition fee. No such certificates will be accepted after the admission.
- Digitised college identity card will be given later.
- *Download fee receipts and other proofs of your online transactions.

Fines

The College Tuition Fee and other charges will be accepted from 1st to 25th of every month. After the expiry of this date a late fine of Rs.1/- per day will be charged. If the fee remains unpaid for three months, the name of the defaulter students will be struck-off from the college rolls. Re-admission may be granted on payment of restoration fee which is equal to one month's tuition fee. No application to waive the fines will be entertained.

Changes of combination of subject or faculty will not be allowed by the college after the completion of online admission.

Admission Pattern

At the UG level the College imparts teaching in Humanities, Social Science, Commerce and Science faculties with recognition from **Kolhan University**, **Chaibasa**.

- Students passing their +2/Intermediate or equivalent examination are eligible to take admission in Four Year Under Graduate B.A./B.SC./B.COM. Semester-I Major.
- Fee charged at the time of admission in Semester-I will be inclusive of the charges of Semester-II.
- Students have to take fresh admission in the third, fifth and seventh semesters.
- Fee charged at the time of admission in Semester III, V & VII will be inclusive of the fee of Semester IV, VI & VIII respectively.

- There shall be University Examination at the end of each semester. There shall be Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) or Practical Examination (whichever is applicable) and marks scored in the CIA/Practical will be added in the final score. 75 percent attendance in the classes is compulsory.
- Selection in Major Course is made purely on the basic of merit with minimum 40% marks in the subject concerned.



SUBJECT AND COMBINATION FOR SEMESTER

Important Highlights of NEP 2020 for FYUGP Student:

- Multiple entry and exit; Student may exit after completing 1st year (2 semesters), 2nd year (4 semesters), and 3rd year (6 semesters) and may re-enter within a given time period to complete the course.
- After completing one year the students are entitled for a certificate, after second year they are entitled for a diploma, after third year they are entitled for a UG degree and after fourth year they will receive a Hons. or Hons. with Research degree.
- Score of 7.5 CGPA till third year (six semesters) is necessary for promotion to Hons. with Research in the fourth year.

- Students with a score of less than 7.5 CGPA till third year (six semesters) will be promoted in the fourth year to get a Hons. degree but this will be without Research.
- Elective Subjects (Major & Minor) will not change but there will be changes in compulsory subjects in each semester. Students are directed to collect information about their compulsory subjects at the beginning of each semester.

Note: Students and their parents should compulsorily attend the Induction Meeting organized by the college. Information about the date and time of induction meeting will be given to the students through MIS, college website and college notice board.

ADMISSION BULLETIN FOR POST GRADUATE COURSES

The college is admitting students in the First Semester of its Post Graduate courses under the CBCS system for the academic session 2024-25. Online admission in M.A. Urdu, M.A. English, M.A. Psychology, M.A. Political Science, M.Sc. Mathematics, M.Sc. Chemistry, and M. Com. is available through Chancellor's Portal. After the completion of online admission the student should contact the college office for confirmation of his/her admission. He/She will have to purchase the College Prospectus and application form from the college counter after a payment of Rs. 500. The completely filled in form along with the photocopy of all required documents has to be submitted in the office within two days after the issue of form.

Steps for Admission

- The first part of the whole admission process has to be done online.
- · Candidates are required to apply through Chancellor's Portal.
- A Selection List will be published. After their selection in the list the candidates have to pay the Registration fee of Kolhan University through the Chancellor's Portal.
- After completion of the above process the candidates are now required to go to the website of the college for the online payment of college fee. The college may allow the candidate for offline payment also.
- After online payment of college fee the students have to contact the college office in person and purchase the college prospectus along with a form from the college counter.
- The completely filled in form along with attested/scanned copies of mark sheets of the qualifying exam and other testimonials should be submitted to the college within two or three days.
- The colleges reserve every right to cancel the admission in case of any misappropriation or misconduct on part of the selected candidate.
- · Candidates have to collect their College Roll Numbers and a fee receipt.
- Selected candidates are required to complete the Registration process of Kolhan University as and when directed by the university.

- The following documents will be required for submission at the time of verification:
 - Originals College Leaving Certificate with a photocopy of the same.
 - Photocopies of Mark sheets (Matric, Intermediate & Graduation) & Admit Card.
 - Original Migration Certificate (If required)
- Selected candidates, belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes, are required to submit the Xerox copy of their caste certificate along with original income certificate. In case of non-availability of any of the said certificates, the application of the concerned students will not be forwarded to the welfare Dept. for grant of financial help from the Govt. and he/she will have to pay the tuition fee. No such certificates will be accepted after the admission.
- Digitised college identity card will be given later.
- *Download fee receipts and other proofs of your online transactions.

Fines

The College Tuition Fee and other charges will be accepted from 1st to 25th of every month. After the expiry of this date a late fine of Rs. 1/- per day will be charged. If the fee remains unpaid for three months, the name of the defaulter students will be struck-off from the college rolls. Re-admission may be granted on payment of restoration fee which is equal to one month's tuition fee. No application to waive the fines will be entertained.

Admission Pattern

At PG level the College imparts teaching in Humanities, Social Science, Commerce and Science faculties with recognition from Kolhan University, Chaibasa.

- Students passing their graduation or equivalent examination are eligible to take admission in M.A., M.Sc., M.Com. Semester-I.
- Students have to take fresh admission in each semester.
- There shall be University Examination at the end of each semester. There shall be Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) or Practical (whichever is applicable) and marks scored in this will be added in the final score.
