





























LEARNING OUTCOMES

- OBE is closely monitored through established methodologies
- IQAC has developed its monitoring and assessment methodology through a team of teachers
- COs Achievement levels, ranging from Level 1 (low) to Level 3 (high) measure the percentage of students surpassing class average, offering a precise assessment of skill acquisition and proficiency
- Similarly, POs achievement levels categorised from Level 1 (poor) to Level 5 (excellent) consolidate performance across all programmes to assess overall accomplishments against predefined standards

WELFARE MEASURES FOR STAFF

- The institution is sensitive towards the welfare and financial health of its teaching and non-teaching staff
- Several welfare measures are available and taken time to time to facilitate them
- The college gives financial support to the Teachers' Association and Non-teaching Staff Association for their functions and activities
- Fee waivers for the wards of teachers and non-teaching staff is available on demand
- Teachers' Welfare Society and Non-teaching Staff Welfare Society has been running separately as joint ventures between the teaching/non-teaching staff and the college management in which the college contributes the largest share of funds annually.
- The total amount collected against the name of an employee is given to him/her at the time of retirement.
- The Welfare Society also provides interest free loans to teachers/non-teaching staff in case of illness of the staff member.



WELFARE MEASURES FOR STAFF

- The teaching and non-teaching staff are also running their separate Credit Societies with the permission of the college management
- Duty leaves are granted to the faculty members in connection with research projects or for attending seminars or conferences
- Prior to 2012 when the state government was not providing pension and retirement benefits to the teachers of minority colleges working on permanent government sanctioned with finance posts the college management used to pay an amount of Rs 1.75 lacs as gratuity to the retired teachers. Now, when the state government has started giving pension and other retirement benefits to the teachers of minority colleges working on permanent government sanctioned posts from 2012 the college management has not withdrawn the amount of Rs 1.75 lacs given as gratuity. The same has been renamed as Post Retirement Care Scheme.
- The college is giving PF and medical benefits under ESIC to all such teaching and non-teaching staff who are not on government payroll.
- Very recently the college management has implemented its policy of Financial Support to teachers for attending seminars/conferences/workshops/FDPs and for publication. The college offers TA and Seminar Registration fee and gives cash rewards for publication of research.

SWOC ANALYSIS STRENGTHS

- The college is very proud of its dynamic team. We have very committed teaching faculty who build the institution by their steady academic accomplishments and their acumen and activism towards teaching & learning. Our non-teaching staff members also work in tandem to create a very vibrant and efficient work culture in the campus.
- Student diversity within the campus is also a major strength of the institution. In terms of gender, religion, language, culture and lifestyles, the campus boasts of a diverse composition and such plurality makes the college a safe and encouraging space for teaching, learning, and various forms of expression.
- Innovative pedagogical methods inside the classroom constitute another remarkable strength of the institution. The various departments of the college keep students interested and engaged in their learning journeys with blended classrooms, group discussion forums, student seminars, group projects, and other creative methods of learning.
- While the college is proud of the academic performance of its students, their continued excellence in extra-curricular activities is also a valuable strength of the institution. The college is proud of the achievements of its students in sports, NCC, NSS, and literary and cultural activities like creative writings, debates, music, theatre, dance and fine

SWOC ANALYSIS WEAKNESSES

- ➤ The location of the campus, once an strength because of being at the heart of the city, has lately become an important weaknesses for the institution. Owing to the expansion plans of the local industrial tycoon, there has been a radical increase in air and sound pollution in the region. This has impacted the ambience of teaching and learning to a considerable strength. This has also been resulted in the safety and health concerns of our stakeholders.
- The immense delay in academic promotions on the part of the university and government adversely effects the morale of our teaching staff. To be unable to facilitate it in any way is a major weakness.
- The cost of education has increased, influenced our stakeholders, especially parents, as most of our learners come from middle & low income groups. Being a grant-in-aid college most of our expenses related to infrastructural development & maintenance and support facilities have to be borne by our own resources. A higher fee structure, in comparison to the government colleges, has become a weakness in the post-covid times of economic depression. Many meritorious students are unable to continue their studies unless assisted by fee waivers.
- Absence of hostel and transport facilities is also a weakness.

SWOC ANALYSIS OPPORTUNITIES

- Working towards acquiring the status of an autonomous college is a vital opportunity for the institution. An autonomous status will go a long way in establishing growth-centric academic & infrastructural policies and vitalising the academic environment.
- Collaborations and linkages with local industries are a good opportunity for offering students training and internships under NEP and an entry into the job market.
- The enthusiasm of students for extra-curricular engagement offers a good opportunity to serve culture and to work towards greater community outreach programmes targeting the minority communities and the weaker section of the society. This will allow the institution to play a greater role in local welfare.
- ➤ Given the tribal region we work in and the large number of tribal students in the campus, carrying out interdisciplinary research work in tribal epistemologies is a major opportunity for the faculty members of the college.

SWOC ANALYSIS CHALLENGES

- The privatisation of education and the proliferation, in the city, of private universities that offer modern amenities, new courses, and flexible modes of education, has led to a decrease in admissions in state-sponsored universities.
- The implementation of NEP by the state of Jharkhand in successive stages and the student confusion involved therein, has also been responsible for a lack of assurance in the academic scene.
- Post-covid, the fall in attendance has been an alarming issue. Many students from not so sound economic backgrounds or those who have lost a parent to Covid, are choosing to combine degrees with day jobs and this has become a major challenge.
- The necessity to manage the new courses offered under FYUGP under NEP 2020, to arrange teachers for the new compulsory courses under AEC, SEC and VAC is a significant challenge.
